Race Follows a New Course Along the Rail Trail and Incorporates the Rail Runner

Santa Fe, N.M., September X, 2023—The 2nd annual Santa Fe International Half The marathon/5K/1 mile run unfolds on a new course along the Rail Trail on Sunday, September 17, 2023. This year's incarnation, unique from those that preceded it, begins and ends at the South Capitol Rail Runner station. Start times are 6:30 AM for the Half Marathon and First Responders Relay and 7 AM for Coach Doug McTernan Memorial 5K and 1 Mile races.

Additional new elements in 2023 include live music along the course and a roundtrip ride on the Rail Runner, departing at 9:30 AM from the South Capitol Station to transport runners to the Railyard Station for a post-race community celebration and award ceremony at Nuckolls Brewing. Runners can enjoy one free drink when they present their bib to bartenders, and participants & families can play games and listen to live music while having brews and bites on the Nuckolls lawn. The 3:05 PM train transports runners back to the South Capitol Station.

Race organizer Abraham Kosgei says, "I am so excited for this race and how it has always and will continue to bring runners together from around the world with a shared a vision of empowering the next generation through their love of running."
