

DIRECTIONS TO THE CONSERVATION HOMESTEAD

From Santa Fe, get on I-25 N/US-285 S
 Take exit 290 for US-285 S toward Clines Corners
 Turn right onto Astral Valley Rd
 Turn left onto Thornton Ranch Rd
 Until a parking area has been constructed, please park at the Cottonwood Trailhead and continue on foot to the property (about 3/4 of a mile)

Conservation Homestead

A Property of the Santa Fe Conservation Trust

In March 2020, Santa Fe Conservation Trust (SFCT) was able to purchase this 300-acre parcel in the Galisteo Basin. This is a place where people have lived for centuries. It is the unceded territory of the Tewa and Tano people, who were the original stewards of the land. It is also home to many native plants and animals, and part of an important corridor allowing plants and animals the ability to roam and adapt to a changing climate. It is a major focal point for our conservation work and an area where we work to connect our protected properties to provide critical connectivity to impact the loss of biodiversity and climate change in this region.

Trails: The property is open to the public from dawn to dusk, featuring four miles of new trails that connect to the 50 miles of trails at the Galisteo Basin Preserve. All of the Homestead trails are open to hikers, bikers and equestrians. No motorized vehicles are allowed on the property. Because restoration work is underway here, please stay on the trails or in the arroyos.
